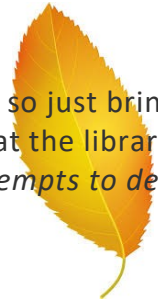


Mon. 14th, 6pm: Book Talk: Stories From the Bird Lady

Marsh Haven Nature Center director Renee Wahlen will discuss her recently published book, "Stories from the Bird Lady," a compilation of articles written over a 30 year period by raptor rehabilitator Barbara Harvey, who passed away in 2016. The book contains fascinating insights into wild birds of prey, the struggles of wildlife rehab, and personal moments. "Stories from the Bird Lady" will be available at \$25 each.
